## Reference Frameworks for Diabetes Care and Hypertension Care for Adults in Primary Care Settings

Two locally developed reference frameworks for the care of patients with chronic diseases, one on diabetes and the other on hypertension, are available to healthcare professionals practising in primary care settings in Hong Kong.

### Reference Frameworks Development

The two reference frameworks, titled the “Hong Kong Reference Framework for Diabetes Care for Adults in Primary Care Settings” and “Hong Kong Reference Framework for Hypertension Care for Adults in Primary Care Settings”, were developed by the Task Force on Conceptual Model and Preventive Protocols of the Working Group on Primary Care and the Food and Health Bureau. This Task Force, under the leadership of the convenor, Professor Sian GRIFFITHS, adopts a population approach in the prevention and control of diabetes and hypertension across the life course in the development of the reference frameworks. Recommendations in the reference frameworks are evidence-based and appropriate to local primary care settings. In order to ensure the latest available evidence is included in the reference frameworks, two Clinical Advisory Groups under the Task Force and comprising members from academia, professional organisations and stakeholders have also been established to review and update the reference frameworks on a regular basis.

### Support from Professional Organisations and Stakeholders

Apart from the Department of Health and the Hospital Authority, other major stakeholders including the Universities, the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine and the relevant Colleges, and a number of professional organisations have shown their full support regarding the development and promulgation of the reference frameworks.

### Content of the Reference Frameworks

The reference frameworks consist of a Core Document and a series of Modules. They cover useful information on primary prevention, early identification of diseases, treatment and care, management of complications, as well as patient education and empowerment.

### Benefits of Adoption

The reference frameworks provide common reference for healthcare professionals in Hong Kong in providing continuing, comprehensive, and evidence-based primary care services to the patients. Through the rigorous development process and regular updating mechanisms, they ensure the recommended treatment and care are based on the best available scientific evidence. In addition, patients and carers could be empowered with appropriate knowledge and skills in the management of these chronic diseases.

### Using the Reference Frameworks to Support Decision Making

The reference frameworks are constructed from global evidence of best practice. As with all guidance they aim to support decision making, recognising that all patients are unique and have their own needs. The frameworks provide support for decision making and as such are not mandatory. They should not be construed as within any legal framework, rather as guidance for professional practice. The responsible primary care practitioners should only arrive at a particular treatment procedure or care plan following discussion with the patient on the diagnostic and treatment choices available.
